From the Pastor's Study

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one.⁵ You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.⁶ And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. ⁷ You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.⁸ You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes.⁹ You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." Deuteronomy 6:4-9

February often feels like a time of transition. Christmas and its season came in a hurry and upon its leaving many felt as if everything came to a screeching halt. Everything seems to slow down a little bit and we can breathe for a few weeks before we start getting ready for spring break, Easter, and then summer vacation. Yes in no time at all you will be thinking about where this summer you will be traveling.

Yet, before all of this comes upon us the Church will be starting another season of preparation, Lent. Lent is a season of preparation and teaching. In fact people in the ancient Church would be starting their catechesis the week of Ash Wednesday and finishing it the week of Holy Week. This would put them in line for introduction into the Church on Easter vigil. In the ancient Church Lent was the season for learning.

We in the Church today are so busy that maybe that slowdown I talked about never really happens anymore. We have sports, things to watch on television, dance, band, and so much more. We live in a fast paced society that never really seems to slow down. We do not seem to take the time to observe seasons of the Church, let alone life. All these things are not bad in themselves, but they do distract us from our primary vocation as the people of God, that is to be disciples.

In Deuteronomy we hear how Moses encourages the people to continue to teach and learn. Learn about who God is and how we relate to Him. He reminds us how He rescued us through His Son, by His life, death, and resurrection. In turn we hear how God calls us to respond as His people. We also are called to teach, teach what it is we have learned.

Moses reminds us that in every moment of life we are given opportunities to teach about God and all He has done. It happens as we arise to a new day and give thanks for our breakfast and new morning. It occurs as we commute around town and see those God has given to aid us in our lives. We are given chances to teach as we struggle with our sins and our failings through reconciliation. Each and every moment we have opportunities to teach and learn about God and all that He is doing.

We are given the privilege and the responsibility to learn about God and to share what we learn with those around us. As we look toward a very busy day, week, month, or year, let us not fail to stop learning about God and what He has done for us. May we also continue to share it will those around us, especially the little ones of the Kingdom of God.

Jesus reminds us of the importance of study and His Word in our lives when He says, "*Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.*" Matthew 24:35.
