IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH SPECIAL VOTERS' ASSEMBLY November 13, 2018

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Kronsbein. With 30 members present, we had a quorum and could vote on church business.

Jim opened with a prayer.

There was a single item for consideration.

Mr. Frank reported on lighting upgrades that the school would like to install. Earlier this year, there was an administrator's meeting at which there was a presentation about a joint venture with the Synod and Energy Efficiency Pros.

The project would include replacing every lamp, fixture in the hallway, art room and gym. There is a 5yr warranty on the bulbs, a 10yr on the fixtures.

The project costs include:

Fee to EEPros Labor to contractor (required to hire local labor)	\$13,366.00 \$6,262.00
Turnkey project	\$19,627.00
Payback period Avg. Annual Return 10yr operating savings	2.42 years 27% \$53,728.00
Net Present Value	\$21,223.00

The city will provide an annual 6% discount rate.

Questions:

- All fixtures or just some? *Just some, some have already been upgraded.*
- Loan from Synod approved? Not yet applied for; school has funds will apply for loan to repay school.
- Utility Rate and annual debt service? *Annual utility rate increase is 4%, discount will be 6%.* 10yr operating savings will be \$53,728.
- Is the church paying or just approving? *Just approving*.
- Will this be a loan or pay outright? Both. Pay outright then research a loan to repay school.

Rodney indicated that this will cut the school's monthly bill considerably.

Mr. Frank indicated that the work is scheduled to begin next week (Thanksgiving week) and the contractors will work Monday and Tuesday (off Wednesday and Thursday) and finish on Friday and Saturday. Dennis Fuehring made a motion to approve the project as outlined. Bill Meyer seconded. Jim called for a vote – motion carried, project approved.

With no other business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at approximately 7:45 PM.

Pastor Brandon opened with a short devotion based on Psalm 127. He concluded with a prayer.

Kevin noted that the first payment for the lighting upgrades at the school was written in December. Janet Bredehoeft asked about the mission line item in the church budget and Kevin explained that there was a \$25,000 bequest from Esther Deke that was recorded as a mission donation.

Jim called for a motion to approve the treasurer's report – motion made by Paul Holsten and seconded by Oscar Fricke. Hearing no additional discussion motion carried.

Bible studies are going well. Numbers have decreased a bit but the study of the gospel of Matthew continues. The mother's bible study is for any age and continues to grow.

With no questions for Pastor, Jim asked for a motion to approve the Pastor's report. Motion was made by Vaughn Owens, seconded by Steve Wooden. Motion carried.

Board of Elders: Robert Nolte

The Elders reported the following:

- 1. In January Steve Harms will be the assistant usher and Derk Wampler will become the head usher.
- 2. The Elders are recommending that the Christmas Eve offering be donated to the Lutheran Campus Ministries on the UCM Campus in Warrensburg. Janet Bredehoeft seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Principal's Report: Mr. Dave Frank

Mr. Frank reported that the school year is going well.

- The language and social studies programs have expanded.
- Several of the computers are being upgraded.

- The magnetic door locks have been installed on all doors except the east door which is still a keyed lock. Cards to access the school will be issued shortly to those who need them. There will be a lock box installed to allow remote unlock and will contain a magnetic key for access by emergency personnel.
- The kitchen report will be presented by Kathie Fricke.
- An application for a grant was applied for and granted for the trees to be installed on the south side of the church.
- The school board will meet next Tuesday (12/18) to vote on a new principal. The individual who has applied is currently employed and will be announced if approved and after they resign from their current position.
- Lighting upgrades will start next week.
- Mr. Frank reported that the purpose of the school is truly for kids to understand how much God loves them.
- The conference that was attended the week of Thanksgiving went well.
- The Candlelight service will be on 12/19 Donna Owens has that well under control.

Kathie Fricke reported that the PTL has purchased a new, commercial dishwasher that will save a lot of time in the kitchen. There is new plumbing that will have to be installed and an existing sink moved. The PTL would like the church to pay for the plumbing and it will probably be less than \$1,000 but no official estimate was available at the time of the meeting.

Association: No Additional Information

Board of Trustees: Rodney Erdman

Rodney reported the following:

- Stunkle extended the concrete ramp on the north side of the church. Cost was \$1,400. The handrail was also extended and cost \$650.
- Carpets and cushions in the church were cleaned by Service Master at a cost of \$130.
 Curtis purchased anti-slip strips for under the cushions on the pews.
- Kyle Dobson cleared the sidewalks during the last snowstorm – no bill yet. Scott Rasa cleared the parking lots (donated that work).
- Pole light on the south side of the east parking lot has been repaired by the city at no cost to the church.
- The chair lift keys have been secured on a chain so they don't disappear.

- Marilyn Boeschen's piano will be donated to the church. Of the two pianos in the church basement, one will go to the school and Pastor will take the other one. Steve Waters, a piano tuner from the KC area will be in charge of the moving. He has the equipment and will take any piano that we no longer want. It will cost around \$500 to get them all moved but he will reduce the cost if we provide some labor (to between \$250 and \$400). The piano's weight about 350 or 400 pounds and so it's critical to have someone with the equipment and knowledge move them. This will happen around December 18, in the late afternoon. Terri indicated that one of the pianos was acquired because the other was no longer tunable.
- The lighting project in the school will be upgraded before the end of the year. The school will pay for the project and not seek financing. Half of the materials have been paid for.
- Rodney recently reported that there was a crack in the art room ceiling. Mueller's Metal put in place a beam/column to support the ceiling and prevent further cracking. Cost was \$406.35.
- Ted Draper and Marsha Tomchaney donated a new garbage disposal to the school valued at \$152. The Trustees would like to thank them both.
- At the parsonage, a third bid was acquired from Stuenkle concrete to do work on the driveway area. His bid was \$4,099, a bit higher (\$950) than the other bids, but the work is more significant and will provide a much safer area for the family. Dennis Fuehring mentioned that this work is really necessary and will prevent cars from getting stuck in the yard which happened during the last rainstorm. The Trustees made a motion to accept the bid from Stuenkle, Donna Owens seconded. Jim called for a vote – motion carried.

Mark Schnare asked how the church was doing on the YTD funds needed. Kevin explained that we have received \$327,415.13 to date, had budgeted to receive \$319,694 and so we are ahead by \$7,722.13.

Church Council: John Frerking

John reported that Janet Bredehoeft's term is expiring on the Finance Board but she has accepted a Member at Large position to help with the transition. The Council appreciates her support.

Saving Grace Outreach: Myra FuehringMyra reported the following:

- Four deliveries were made to Messiah Lutheran with hygiene bags and warm things for the Messiah Homeless/Needy ministry. Many thanks to all who donated. We will consider collecting hygiene bags and summer clothing in the spring.
- As Mr. Frank reported, the MO Department of Conservation has given us a tree grant in the amount of \$500. We had applied for \$1,000 so may receive additional funding in the Spring. We will be able to have some trees planted on the south side of the church in the Spring.
- We have advertised in the ad sheet to see who might need transportation to church. We were able to match up one person with a driver(s).
- We delivered Meals on Wheels to our community last week. In 2019 our church will take a turn every 8 weeks. We appreciate all those so willing to serve others.
- Look for changes/updates to our Prayer Ministry at our next meeting.
- Kathie Fricke reports that she will be sending out Christmas cards to our military and one APO address will get a package.
- We are requesting card showers for people on our prayer list. We will try to have no more than three card requests in a week, unless needs are immediate.

- Starting in January we will request birthday cards for shut-ins during their birthday month.
- A reminder, we are happy to arrange transportation for chemo/radiation treatments and meals when needed. Please let Pastor know your needs.
- Shut-in visits continue.

Voting

Ballots were distributed to vote for new officers and board members for the 2019 year. Mr. Frank, Oscar Fricke and Bert Sowers collected and counted the ballots. The following individuals were elected:

Jim reported that Donna Brown and Keith and Janet Bredehoeft have volunteered to be the Auditing Committee to review 2018 books. Jim thanked them for volunteering.

Donna reminded everyone that candlelight service will be on December 19. The offering from the December 12 advent meal will go to the choir and school for music needs.

Jim indicated that the church needs to select a member to vote for the synodical officers. Pastor explained that previously the church representative that attended the synodical convention voted for officers. The rules changed and now we can simply appoint someone without sending anyone to convention. Jim called for a volunteer to vote. The volunteer will receive an email from the synod with a link to the voting site and will then simply vote online. The member selected to vote must be named in the Voters' Meeting notes that they were approved to vote. Kathie Fricke asked if the person had to attend the convention and Pastor answered no. Jim asked for a volunteer, Kevin Thurmon volunteered. Jim made a motion to accept Kevin Thurmon as our designated voter. Steve Wooden seconded. Jim called for a vote - motion carried.

Kevin Thurmon will be our designated voter for synod officers.

Kevin presented the proposed church budget for 2019. Janet explained the budget increases and decreases proposed for 2019 which total a net increase of \$18,512 to the budget. Kevin reminded us that these are budget numbers and so may increase or decrease as we go through the year.

Donna Owens asked about the utility budget and wasn't the installation of the new lights supposed to help cut that in half. Kevin indicated that those figures were in the school budget not the church budget.

Janet Bredehoeft made a motion to accept the budget as presented. Steven Wooden seconded the motion. Motion carried, budget for 2019 was approved.

Budget detail is available on request.

Mr. Frank reported that the technology group is working to set up a live broadcast channel on YouTube.

Donna Owens reported that pictorial directories are being prepared and should be available after the first of the year.

With no other business, the meeting adjourned at approximately 8:00 P.M. and closed with the Lord's Prayer.
